As for Erin and myself we are just hearing "Sunrise Sunset" playing on loop in our heads.

Although I have not forgotten (if not always followed) my advice from last week's letter. That although this week has been filled with many practical concerns, I have been mindful of not letting the immediate concerns of this world distract me from focusing on what it truly important. So much so that I wanted to expand on that thought more this week. If I asked you what are Wesley's 3 simple rules or the general rules of Methodism I would hope I'd get an answer close to: "Do no harm, Do all the good you can, and Stay in love with God" However that is not how Wesley worded the last phrase. We have modernized that one and I feel that we may have lost something in the translation. What Wesely wrote was "to attend upon all the ordinances of God."

In our modern parlance that may be better translated to keep up with our spiritual disciplines or practices. Welsey illuminated what these practices were. While many of the practices you expect were there: attending worship, receiving communion, being in prayer and studying the Word there were others that we might not initially think of as spiritual practices. These included visiting the sick and prisoners. He knew from his own experience that often one of the best ways to fill spiritual full was in fact to pour out the Spirit on others. In that same vain he included family prayer and Bible study to this list. I often find myself closest to God when I see the Spirit of God at work in my children. Also, it's kind of hard to be doing something you know you shouldn't be doing when you just taught your 5 year old that it's not something that God thinks is beneficial to us. He also lists accountability and acts of charity in this list. Faith is not a journey we are meant to walk alone. We grow in our bound of fellowship much quicker and deeper when we are out serving others together than sitting in worship together. Also doing no harm to your or anyone else's spiritual wellbeing is a lot easier when you have someone you trust with your struggles who truly cares for your soul. So if God feels far away or if today feels mundane rather than miraculous by all means pick up your Bible and send out a prayer but also consider picking up your phone and calling someone you know is having a hard time or reach out your hand that you may raise up a stranger. You'll find that God never went anywhere and He's closer than you think.
