Last week in worship, we turned to prophets Malachi and John the Baptist, and were invited through scripture to look beyond personal serenity and consider the kind of peace our <u>world</u> needs. Both prophets proclaimed that the Messiah was coming with a peace that purifies, restores, and reorders the world.

While having a sense of inward, quiet peace is important for our well-being, the world is bigger than our personal serenity. We cannot have "peace on earth" while people still suffer under systems of oppression and inequality. Nor can we claim true peace for ourselves while others are denied safety, dignity, or freedom. So we pray and work for the "peace that was meant to be." A peace where evil, oppression, and injustice are no more. A peace God intends for all creation to have and experience.

This week we will talk about Unexpected Joy. Give Isaiah 61:1–4, 8–11 and Luke 1:39–55 a read and let the Holy Spirit start to stir in your heart and prepare you for what God has to say to us on Sunday.

I wanted to share with you some AMAZING things some of our younger disciples have said recently. In Discipleship Group a few Sundays ago, Kathy Mahraun gave her students an opportunity to make a list of some ideas to "petition the pastors." This week I asked our P3 students to write out their definition of Church. Give them all a good read and let them wow, bless, and inspire you!

- More baptisms
- More prayer
- Sunday night fun (early) family and food
- Sand Volleyball pit (student said he would make this his Eagle Scout project)
- Always donuts
- Game night.
